15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

In the fields of arts, science, and commerce, our college offers 21 programmes (13 UG, 6 PG, and 2 Ph.D.). The institution, which is located in a semi-rural area, accepts students from lower socioeconomic strata of society. The institution's aim and

objective are to give students the greatest education possible through highly trained faculty who are experts in their specialties. Students' diverse abilities in the arts and sports are given special attention in order to develop and be showcased. The college's NCC and NSS units are doing a fantastic job moulding the students into responsible citizens of our country. The academic programmes are followed exactly as outlined in the university syllabus. One open course is offered by UG Departments in the fifth semester. All students in the institution are allowed to enrol in the open course, with the exception of those enrolled in the parent department. This will assist the students in gaining an understanding of an other field of study.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Students can earn, collect, and transfer academic credits obtained via a variety of learning activities using a system called an Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) in institutions. With an ABC system, students can receive credits from a variety of sources in opposition to the traditional model, which allows credits to be acquired only through courses attended at a single institution. The college closely adheres to the University of Calicut's curriculum guidelines because it is an associated college of the University. Undergraduate students must take required audit courses in order to learn about environmental studies, gender equality, human rights, and disaster management. The aforementioned courses are not required for students who obtain these credits through online courses such as SWAYAM, MOOC, etc.

17.Skill development:

In order to adequately prepare students for the needs of the modern workforce, educational institutions must implement skill development courses. By providing students with a wide array of skill development programmes, employers can help students discover their areas of interest and talent. The integration of practical instruction, internships, and real-world projects into academic programmes offers students significant chances for experiential learning. Furthermore, improving students' employability and job prospects may be accomplished by awarding certification and recognition for completing skill development courses. All things considered, including skill-building classes into college curricula promotes a more comprehensive strategy for getting students ready for success in the workforce. In collaboration with ASAP, our institution offered several skill-development programmes to students. Through a variety of

initiatives, they sought to help students adjust to new learning environments, provide them with the necessary exposure to help them to plan their careers, and more.Our college's ED club hosted several student talks and workshops. One of them, in collaboration with the Manappuram group, focused on the topic of "Entrepreneurship in Accounting" and emphasised the significance of encouraging students to think like entrepreneurs. Students can get insights into the complexities of launching, producing, and selling fast-moving consumer goods, in the workshop "Production and Marketing of FMCG Products." Students can utilise this kind of programme to learn about the marketing industry.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Online courses that include Indian knowledge systems offer a special chance to conserve and advance traditional expertise. Students can obtain knowledge in a comfortable linguistic setting and interact more fully with their cultural background when taught in Indian languages. Students' sense of pride and belonging is strengthened when Indian culture is incorporated into the curriculum, therefore solidifying their cultural identity. Ensuring the validity and correctness of the subject being taught is ensured by collaboration with professionals and academics across several areas. Our language departments, particularly the Sanskrit department, offered certificate programmes online so that a large number of people could participate.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

By giving students the resources they need for success in their future endeavours, outside of the classroom, OBE focuses on preparing them for real-world applications and achievement outside the classroom. Throughout the year, students had regular assessments, as well as Quality Circle (Peer Group) Learning and Remedial Coaching. Students were asked to interact with resource individuals from various professions. There was a survey of student satisfaction to ensure that the goals were met. A key component of outcome-based education (OBE) is specifying exactly what students should learn.

20.Distance education/online education:

Online learning provides unmatched accessibility by removing geographical barriers by enabling students to access course materials and participate in classes from any location with an internet connection. It offers schedule flexibility, allowing

students to manage their academics alongside other obligations like job or family duties. In addition to their in-class lectures, the instructors provided their students with additional material via online resources. Webinars covering a wide variety of relevant subjects were held for the students. Both instructors and students often utilised the ICT classrooms. A course outcome is prepared for each course based on the Program Outcomes and Program Specific Outcomes.

The HoD prepares the timetable for theory, lab, and project hours based on the credits allotted for each course.

A teaching plan is prepared by the teachers which include both

theory and practical.

Minimum of two internal examinations, assignments, and seminars are conducted for internal evaluation and group discussions, quizzes, case studies are conducted for effective delivery of the curriculum.

Study materials, notes, PowerPoint presentations, and question banks are also provided .

PTA meetings are conducted regularly.

Remedial coaching is provided to slow learners to ensure quality and enhance academic growth.

Periodical meetings are conducted in the Department to review and discuss the curriculum delivery.

Students have to undergo a project and viva voce examination as part of the curriculum.

The departments organize study tours, field projects, internship programs, and industrial visits for students.

As part of mentoring, personal counseling is provided to all the students for identifying problems of the students regarding academic, social, and personal issues.

1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment

1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

The University of Calicut introduced four audit courses viz., Environmental Studies, Disaster Management, Human Rights and Gender Studies for the undergraduate students in the first four semesters.

The College arranges programmes related to Gender Equality, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability.

A seven days residential camp is conducted by the N.S.S. unit for their students to familiarize with the prevailing problems of rural areas and host activities like planting trees, cleaning public spaces, plastic free drive, Poster Competition, Debate, Competition, to create an awareness about nature, biodiversity, environment and sustainability and Free Medical check-ups, AIDS awareness programs, Road safety Campaign, Blood donation camps, etc are also organised.

The Committee for Anti Sexual Harassment , Anti Ragging Committee, WDC and Grievance Redressal Committee organizes programmes on Women Empowerment, Laws for Woman etc. They provide counselling among girl students and also deal with the related issues of safety and security of girls, and staff to ensure gender equality.

Equal representation of both genders is ensured in the leadership positions of class and college level committees.

Celebration of various days like World Environment Day, N.S.S. Day, etc are also organized in the banner of Clean Campus Green Campus.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

A peer teaching method "Quality Circles" is an initiative of Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) for improving the learning outcome of students. This is a group formed among students with a maximum of 15 members, in which three selected student coordinators and 12 other students are grouped together. The student coordinator clarifies the doubts of other students and motivates them to learn the subject. This helps to improve the knowledge level of the student coordinator as well as the other learners and promotes the overall learning of the students in the class. The goals set are achieved through the prompt intervention of teachers. It eeffectively utilize whatsapp group for active learning with proper interaction between slow learners and fast learners for understanding the subject. The record of peer teaching classes is maintained properly. The participation of students, details of the topic taught and the feedback from slow learners have also been recording after everypeer teaching classes.

primarily based on the anonymous student feedback taken per semester .All academic staff in the College fall in one of the three categories, which they have opted to be in: Teacher-Administrator, Teacher-Researcher, or Teacher- Mentor. All categories have teaching load, although the Teacher-Administrators have, in general, 2/3rds of the teaching load of the other two categories.. Depending on the category, they are also assessed against the expected output in their category. The academic staff concerned first fills a self-assessment form, to which his/her supervisor adds their remarks after having had a oneon-one with them. A similar process is followed for both nonteaching and technical staff, but there is greater subjectivity in assessments in their case as unlike teaching feedback and research output, many of the contributions of the non-teaching and technical staff are difficult to quantify. Therefore, the supervisor plays a bigger role in the appraisal process. A structured feedback system is encouraged by IQAC for the betterment of teaching leaning process.

The Practice: The college is closely associated with a special school called Chaithanya for autistic children and also constructed a campus-based organic farm.
