The curriculum and syllabus content were appropriate for your placement and/higher education.



Syllabus is suitable to the course and it is need based



Curriculum is frequently revised as per requirements



Curriculum enables to get relevant knowledge and employment






The curriculum helps in improving the quality of the teaching learning process



The curriculum inculcates soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work



Sufficient number of co-curricular activities were arranged during your study period



The teachers identify your strength and encourages you with providing right level of challenges






The Course is relevant to the present job



The curriculum builds ability to solve workplace problems



The College provides adequate facilities for projects and research



The curriculum enables one to get relevant knowledge and employment



The curriculum accommodates courses with experimental learning



The learning ambience is good



The institution/ faculty helped in placement and higher education



The institution offers sufficient scholarship to deserving students



Sufficient number of co-curricular activities were arranged during the study period




Curriculum and syllabus are need-based



The course outcomes are well defined and clear



Sufficient number of relevant reading material and digital resources is available in the library



The course has good balance between theory and application



The course syllabus of this course increased my knowledge and perspective in the subject area





I have the freedom to adopt new techniques / education tools/ strategies in teaching



I am able to achieve the minimum required course outcome attainment level for my class



The programme of studies carries sufficient number of optional courses






Of the 49 replies, 42 say that the curriculum and syllabus are need based, they also intimated they are free to use new methods and instructional resources while instructing students. When teaching, teachers often incorporate extra material outside the required syllabus. Of the teachers surveyed, 77% agreed that they had contributed to the curriculum as it was outlined in the syllabus. 14 percent of the educators strongly concurred. On this, 12% of the teachers had a neutral opinion. 14% of the instructors strongly disagreed with the statement, making up 16% of the teachers who disagreed.

What do you feel about the course's relevance to the programme



How do you rate the sufficiency of the courses related to industry that are included in the programme



How would you rate competencies/outcomes in respect to the course content



How do you rate the relevance of the topics to the Industry



How would you rate the offering of in comparison to the specialized streams



How do you grade the elective offerings in regard to technological advancements



How do you rate the domains' and tools' applicability in terms of existing industry practices



How do you rate the experiments in terms of their applicability in real life






From the 18 responses it is clear that 14 responses prove that the employers are agreeing that the course was relevant up to the present scenario. They also agree that the electives offered are appropriate for the technological advancements in the current situation. They added the topics are relevant to the industry. 33 percent of employers marked it as excellent. 27 percentages marked it as very good and 33 percentage marked it as good.

Action Taken Report

Student Feedback

All students were given feedback forms, and after that, almost all of them said that the curriculum was appropriate for their future needs. They concurred that regular curriculum revisions altered the way students interacted with one another in the classroom. This will offer a range of ICT resources for curriculum transaction in the classroom.. However a few students expressed worry about the courses emphasis on employment and skill development. The college staff council received identical papers for review and possible follow- up, and the IQAC convened to discuss the student concerns. It has been decided that in addition to their curriculum, employability, life skills, and soft skills should be included through certificate programs and supplementary courses. It has been decided to offer more practical sessions in addition to the theoretical classes. For this reason, purely academic field trips and industrial visits will be made. Additional time was allotted for the pupils; extracurricular activities.

Teacher Feedback

To allow students to engage in more activities, it is asked that the departments host more academic activities like seminars and workshops. The vocational counselling and placement unit has been directed to take action to increase to allow students to engage in more activities, it is asked that the departments host more seminars and workshops. It is the job of the career advising and placement cell to start recruiting more people on campus. The postgraduate departments of Commerce, Sanskrit, and Malayalam will soon be promoted to research departments.

Employer Feedback

The college curriculum and syllabus were reviewed by employers in the field, who were asked to provide input via a feedback form. We did not receive a large number of responses. Everyone who participated gave positive comments, and employers also sent in a few recommendations that were discussed in the College Staff Council and IQAC meeting and formed the framework for the activities that followed. A broader introduction to business and practical knowledge is essential for students studying in both commerce and the arts. It has been recognized that this is the main fault. Planning seminars and gatherings with eminent people is necessary to increase their practical expertise. Certifications or add-ons will be provided for courses covering job-oriented skills including real-time accounting and tally.

Alumni Feedback

The College Council's decisions were based on the feedback it got from former students. This academic year, there will be more job fairs hosted by respectable companies. The ICT resources that are provided in the classrooms must be used to hold classes. An application was submitted to the university with the intention of converting the PG departments of Commerce and Malayalam into Research Departments. To boost students confidence in their ability to participate in group discussions and competitive tests, the Language and Literary Club set out to create a Speech and Debate Club. The Career Guidance and Placement Cell evaluated the responses and scheduled career development classes to look into professional opportunities and continue with further education.
