


Figure 1 Curriculum and syllabus were appropriate for placement and higher education




Figure 2 The syllabus is suitable to the course and is need based




Figure 3 Curriculum is frequently revised as per syllabus




Figure 4: Curriculum enables to get better knowledge and employability




Figure 5 Curriculum facilitates in cognitive, social and emotional growth




Figure 6 The curriculum helps in improving teaching quality




Fig 7 Curriculum inculcated soft skills, life skills and employability skills




Figure 8 Sufficient Number of Co-Curricular Activities were arranged




Figure 9 Teachers identify strength and encourages in providing right challenges




Figure 10 College provides ample opportunities for out of the class learning




Figure 1 Curriculum and syllabus are need-based.




Figure 2 The course outcomes are well defined and clear




Figure 3 Sufficient number of relevant reading material and digital resources is available in the library




Figure 4 The course has good balance between theory and application




Figure 5 The course syllabus of this course increased my knowledge and perspective in the




Figure 6 I have the freedom to propose modify /suggest and incorporate new topics in the




Figure 7 I have the freedom to adopt a new techniques / education tools/ strategies in




Figure 8 I am able to achieve the minimum required course outcome attainment level for my class.




Figure 9 The programme of studies carries sufficient number of optional courses




Figure 10 I have contributed to the curriculum transaction of the prescribed syllabus




Figure 1 The Course is relevant to the present job




Figure 2 The curriculum builds ability to solve workplace problems




Figure 3 The College provides adequate facilities for projects and research




Figure 4 The curriculum enables one to get relevant knowlegde and employment




Figure 5 The curriculum accommodates courses with experimental learning




Figure 6 The learning ambience is good




Figure 7 The institution/ faculty helped in placement and higher education




Figure 8 The institution offers sufficient scholarship to deserving students




Figure 9 Sufficient number of co-curricular activities were arranged during the study period




Figure 10 The curriculum and syllabus content are appropriate for placement and higher education





Figure 1 Relevance of Course to the Program




Figure 3 Competencies/outcomes in respect to the course content




Figure 4 Competencies/outcomes in respect to the course content




Figure 5 Offering in comparison to the specialised streams




Figure 6 Elective offerings in regard to technological advancements




Figure 7 Domains' and tools' applicability in terms of existing industry practices




Figure 8 Experiments in terms of their applicability in real life




Figure 9 Student's ability to collaborate with employees
