


Figure 1: The curriculum and syllabus content were appropriate for your placement and/higher education.




Figure 2: Syllabus is suitable to the course and it is need based




Figure 3: The College provides adequate facilities for projects and research




Figure 4 Curriculum enables to get relevant knowledge and employment




Figure 5 Curriculum facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth




Figure 6 The curriculum helps in improving the quality of the teaching learning process




Figure 7 The curriculum inculcates soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.




Figure 8 Sufficient number of co-curricular activities were arranged during your study period




Figure 9 The teachers identify your strength and encourages you with providing right level of challenges



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





Figure 2 : The curriculum builds ability to solve workplace problems


Figure 5 : The curriculum accommodates courses with experimental learning










Figure 9 Sufficient number of co-curricular activities were arranged during the study period





Figure 2 : The course outcomes are well defined and clear








Figure 4 : The course has good balance between theory and application




Figure 6 I have the freedom to propose modify /suggest and incorporate new topics in the syllabus through proper forum




Figure 7 I have the freedom to adopt a new techniques / education tools/ strategies in teaching




Figure 8 I am able to achieve the minimum required course outcome attainment level for my




Figure 9 The programme of studies carries sufficient number of optional courses.




Figure 10 I have contributed to the curriculum transaction of the prescribed syllabus




Figure 1 What do you feel about the courses relevance to the programme





Figure 2 How do you rate the sufficiency of the courses related to industry




Figure 4: How do you rate the relevance of the topics to the Industry




Figure 5 : How would you rate the offering of in comparison to the specialised streams

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


Figure 6: How do you grade the elective offerings in regard to technological advancements

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


Figure 7 How do you rate the domains' and tools' applicability in terms of existing industry practices

How do you rate the experiments in terms of their applicability in real life




Figure 8 How do you rate the experiments in terms of their applicability in real life




Figure 9 How would you rate our students' ability to collaborate with you?



Report

A questionnaire was developed and circulated among the employers to identify the present quality of the curriculum with that of the needs of the industry. There was a total of nine questions that the employees had to mark their agreement level. Responses from 20 employers were collected and analyzed. Most of the employers had a very positive opinion on almost all the criteria in the questionnaire such as the relevance, sufficiency, and the outcomes of the course. The electives', specialized streams were also rated on a positive scale by the employer. Suggestions such as providing industrial practices, improving the course according to the needs of the industry, and concentrating on results for each and every student were given.



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ACTION TAKEN REPORT 2023-2024 Based on the Feedback collected from the Stakeholders

Action taken report based on Student Feedback

The feedback collected from the students was analysed and the report then went for discussion by the IQAC and College Council. It has been decided to improve the teaching methodology to improve the results percentage. In addition to the TCS placements, more placements have to be started with reputed companies. Research Methodology UGC-NET, GATE coaching has to be extended from 3.30 to 4.30 in addition to Saturdays and Sundays. The students should be encouraged to access more e-journals and Inflibnet. To increase the pass percentage more Remedial Classes and Quality Circle have to be more active. More emphasis should be given to Mentoring and tutorial activities.

Action taken report based on Teacher Feedback

The feedback collected from the teachers was analysed and discussed with the College council for appropriate action. It has been decided to avail more e-resources in the library and all the faculties are advised to access inflibnet daily including guest faculties. Teachers are encouraged to participate in faculty development programmes to enrich their knowledge level. Like last year, Moodle platform should be extended to this year too.

Action taken based on Employer Feedback

The feedback collected from the Employers of students who were placed last year was collected and the feedback report was placed before the college council for appropriate action. More emphasis should be given to career guidance. Students should be given coaching on 'how to face an interview' and 'how to deal with real-life situations'. More practical-oriented coaching classes should be organised in addition to mere lecturing.



Action taken based on Alumni Feedback

The feedback collected from the alumni was discussed with the College Governing body and appropriate action taken report was made. The students should be equipped with more practical real-life situations. More emphasis should be given to career guidance and counselling. Interactions and sessions with eminent alumni have to be conducted.

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
