PROFILE

The formal inauguration of Sree Krishna College in Guruvayur on 18th July 1964 marks a remarkable moment in the scenario of the Higher Education in our state. Visualized by the Sree Krishna Educational Society, the College started functioning with a Pre-Degree Course affiliated to the Kerala University. The Year 1964 also witnessed the laying of the foundation stone for a permanent building at Ariyannur. In July 1967, the college was shifted to the well-accomplished and spacious building on the extensive campus at the permanent site at Ariyannur. With the inauguration of its Degree courses in Arts and Science affiliated to the Kerala University, the college attained first grade status. In 1976, the Sree Krishna Educational Society was dissolved and the Guruvayur Devaswom Educational Society was formally registered. Thereafter, Sree Krishna College came under the management of the Guruvayur Devaswom. More Degree courses and better infrastructural facilities enabled this institution to climb the academic ladder in quick, yet firm strides. In 1984, the college had its first P.G. Course in Botany. The year 1988 became a momentous year in the history of this institution with its Silver Jubilee celebrations being inaugurated by Sri. E.K. Nayanar, the then Honourable Chief Minister of Kerala. The foundation stone of the Silver Jubilee Auditorium was laid by the then Honourable Prime Minister Sri. Rajiv Gandhi. In 1990 the auditorium was inaugurated by the then Honourable Central Minister for Surface Transport Sri. K.P. Unnikrishnan. The College also takes pride in its innumerable extension activities that have proved to be of immense value to the community around. On Feb. 28, 2005 the college was accredited with a B++ by the NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council), an autonomous institution of the University

Grants Commission. The College was re - accredited by NAAC with 'A' Grade on November 27, 2017. The strength of the college comes to almost 1550 students. The Sree Krishna College aims at scaling great heights in academic excellence as well as responsible social commitment of its students. Its activities continue to focus on the concept that the campus is a microcosm of the society.

The college was formally inaugurated by H.H. The Zamorin Raja of Calicut in the temporary shed put up near Sree Krishna High School at Guruvayur on 18th July 1964. The First Year Pre-Degree Class affiliated to the University of Kerala for I, II and III groups were started with Sri. N. Balakrishnan Nair, Retired Professor as Principal; A Managing Committee headed by Sree Rama Varma Appan Thampuran, the Retired D.P.I. Kerala State, was also constituted. The foundation stone for the main building of the College was laid by H.H. The Zamorin Raja and the construction of the permanent building was started at Ariyannur. In 1965, the second year Pre - Degree class was started. An additional science batch was started in the Pre - Degree class. Sri. N. Balakrishnan Nair, the first Principal ,resigned and Sri. P. Radhakrishna Menon was appointed as the Principal of the College. The Sree Krishna Educational Society with 14 members (5 ex officio) was duly constituted and requested to manage the college. The foundation stones of 2 Hostel Blocks in the new campus were laid by Sri. N.E.S. Raghavachari, Advisor, Kerala State and Sri. M. Bakthavalsalam., the Chief Minister of Madras. In 1966, the N.C.C. Unit of the College was formed. Furthermore, in 1967, the College was shifted to a spacious and imposing buildings on the extensive campus at the permanent site at Ariyannur in July. The construction of the Main building, three hostel blocks and a canteen was completed in August 1967. The College was raised to first grade status and Degree courses affiliated to the Kerala University were started in Arts (Economics, English and Sanskrit) and Science (Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry).

The Commerce group, a sixth batch in Pre-Degree was also started. During 1968, Sri. P. Radhakrishna Menon, Principal, resigned from his post and Sri. M.P. Balakrishna Menon, Professor of English, took charge in June, with the formation of the Calicut University. The boys' hostel started functioning in the permanent buildings. The chairmanship of the managing committee was taken up by Sri. C. Sankaran Nair, Commissioner, HR & CE on the resignation of Sri. Ramavarma Appan Thampuran. The student strength of the college exceeded 1000 during the year. The Degree courses in Botany and Zoology started in September 1969. On the expiry of the term of Sree Krishna Educational Society in March, Sri. D.H. Namboodiripad was nominated as Chairman and the Society was reconstituted. Sri. K.S. Rama Iyer, retired Professor, took charge as Principal. Sri. K.S. Rama Iyer, Principal, resigned in January 1970 and Sri. K. Kesavan Nair, retired Principal - in - charge of Government College Chittur, took charge as Principal in April. The Guruvayur Devaswom came under the direct control of the new Managing Committee constituted by the Government and the S.K.E.S. was reconstituted with Sri. M.P. Muthedath as Chairman in the year 1971. Sri. K.C. Maron Raja H.H. the Zamorin Raja of Calicut became the Chairman of the Sree Krishna Education Society in 1972. The management of the college accepted the condition laid down by the Government for implementing the system of direct payment of salaries to the staff of private colleges.

In 1973, a new block of 5 rooms was constructed on the western side to provide additional accommodation for classes. The B.Com Degree course was started in 1974. In 1975, Sri. K. Kesavan Nair became the Principal & Correspondent of the college and he got retired in the same year. In 1976, Sri. M.P. Balakrishna Menon, Prof. of English was appointed as the Principal - in - charge. The Sree Krishna Educational Society was dissolved. The Guruvayur Devaswom Educational Society

was registered under General Act XXI of 1960 as S. N. 76 of 1976 on 21-03-76. In 1978, Sri. M.P. Balakrishna Menon resigned from the post of Principal and Sri. N. Sundaram, Prof. of Economics, took charge as the Principal. Prof. M. Prabhakaran assumed charge as Principal. The B.A. History course was started in 1979. In 1980, the shift system was introduced for the Pre-Degree Course. In 1981, B.A. Malayalam Course started. An additional batch in Pre-Degree group III also sanctioned. The College came under the direct Management of the Guruvayur Devaswom. In 1984, M.Sc. (Botany) was started. In 1986, Prof. M. Prabhakaran, Principal, retired from service in March and Prof. M. Krishnanunni Menon, Head of the Dept. of Botany, was promoted as Principal. In 1987, Hon'ble Prime Minister Sri. Rajiv Gandhi laid the foundation stone for Silver Jubilee Auditorium on 17th December. In 1988, the Hon'ble Chief Minister Sri. E.K. Nayanar inaugurated the Silver Jubilee celebration on 15th August. In 1990, the Silver Jubilee Auditorium was inaugurated on 17th September by Hon'ble Minister for Surface Transport Sri. K.P. Unnikrishnan. The inauguration of the 400 meter athletic track was done by Sri. V.V. Raghavan, Hon'ble Minister for Agriculture on 1 December.

In the year 1993, Prof. M. Krishnanunni Menon, Principal, retired from service on 30th June and Dr. P. Sankaranarayanan, Dept. of Malayalam was appointed as Principal of the college. The Shift system was discontinued in 1994. In the year 1995, M.Sc. (Physics) got started. In 1998, B.A. (Functional English) and B.Sc. (Biochemistry) were started. The B.A. Functional English Programme was started with the financial aid of the University Grants Commission. In 2003, it became a self - financing course. In 1999, the Department of Botany started a Botanical garden with glass house, and Green house. In the year 2000, M.Com (with foreign Trade Management)

was started. In the year 2001, M.A. Malayalam Language and Literature Course was started. In the year 2002, Pre Degree Course was delinked. When Dr. P. Sankaranarayanan retired from service, Smt.M. Krishnakumari was appointed as Principal in charge. In 2003, Sri.Raveendranath K., Dept. of Commerce was appointed as Principal on 21-3-03. In the year 2005, the College was nationally accredited at B++ Level by NAAC for a period of 5 years. In 2007, the UGC sanctioned Rs. One Crore to construct the Ladies Hostel in the College campus. In 2009 , M.Com, M.A. Malayalam, and B.Sc Biochemistry courses were granted aided status. In 2011, Oct. Dept of Botany was upgraded to Research Centre. In 2011, Sri. Raveendranath.K was appointed as Pro Vice-Chancellor of Calicut University. In the same year, Sri. G. Jayakrishnan, Head of the Department of Botany was appointed as Principal in charge. In 2012, Dr. Damodaran Head of the Department of Commerce took over as Principal in charge. In 2012, Sri. D.Jayaprasad was appointed as Principal on 27-12-2012. In 2013, MA course in Sanskrit started. In 2015, the construction of the building of Ladies Hostel completed. In 2015, the Dept. of Physics was upgraded to Research Centre. In 2015, the Ladies hostel building was inaugurated on 03.10.2015 by the then Hon'ble Home Minister of Kerala, Sri.Ramesh Chennithala. In 2015, Multi - Gym was inaugurated in the Department of Physical Education. In 2017, the College canteen got re-opened. In 2017, the College re - accredited at the national level with 'A' Grade by the NAAC for a period of 5 years. In 2020, Dr.M.R. Lovely was appointed as the Principal of the college. In 2021 Dr. P.S. Vijoy was appointed as Principal in Charge of the College. In 2021, MA Business Economics Course got started. In 2022, Dr. M.K. Harinarayanan was appointed as the Principal in charge of the College from 1-7-2022 to 31-03-2023 . In 2023 Dr. Vijoy. P.S was appointed as Principal in charge of the College from 1-4-2023 onwards

MANAGEMENT OF THE COLLEGE

The Guruvayur Devaswom established Sree Krishna College, Guruvayur in 1964. The College having two Research Centres, six PG Programmes, and 13 UG Programmes is affiliated to the University of Calicut and is included under sections 2(f) and 12 B of the UGC. The inception of the College also witnessed the realization of the long cherished dream of the people of Guruvayur to have a co-educational centre of higher education with special focus on the promotion of Sanskrit. The College is ably assisted by the Devaswom in all its activities and requirements.

III. RESEARCH CENTRES

- **Centre for Atmospheric and Climate Research :**

The Centre for Atmospheric and Climate Research is specialized laboratory dedicated to advancing reseach in climate science. It opertates under the department of Physics and the reaserch centre. Established in 2017, the centre has had two PhD candidates complete their programes, while five other are pursuing their degrees in atmosperic science. The primary reaserch areas at the centre include the study of extreme climate events, variations in trace air pollutants, long - term changes in particulate matter, thunderstorm dynamics, and boundary layer dynamics. - **Centre for Language Documentation and Preservation :**

The Centre for Language Documenation and Preservation established in 2024 under the department of Malayalam at Sreekrishna College focus on Centre for Language Documentation and Preservation focuses on documenting and preserving endangered languages and cultures. It aims to safeguard linguistic diversity by engaging in projects that document tribal dialects, oral traditions. and cultural practices. The Centre also undertakes initiatives to promote awarness about the significance of linguistic heritage and cultural preservation. With ongoing projects in collaboration with scholars and institutions, The centre serves as a hub for language research and contributes to preserving the rich cultural tapestry of marginalized communities.

Fee Rules

1. Tuition fee will be collected in 3 instalments. The first instalment including the special fee and caution deposit prescribed will be collected on the day of admission.
2. Subsequent instalments will be collected on the days noted in the Calendar. If the fees & fines are not paid within 15 days from the due date, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the College. She / he has to be re-admitted and She / he has to apply for the special permission of the Principal besides remitting the arrears of fees with fine. If the fees and the fines are not paid on the 11th day or within 15 days from due date, the name of the student will be entered in a special register of the defaulters and the Principal will watch the payment of fees defaulted. The attendance of the student should also be taken every day as usual and his attendance or absence should be marked. If the student settles the arrears of fees with fine before the last opportunity given for such a settlement She / he should be granted attendance or her/his absence is recorded. If the student does not pay the dues till the last date prescribed, She / he would not be allowed to appear for the examination.
3. The caution deposit to be paid by a student for a particular course shall be retained in the institution till the completion of the course of study. At the end of the particular course of study the caution deposit realised from the student will be refunded to him/her on receipt of application from the student in the form prescribed in the college office after adjusting the dues if any on account of
i) Loss of library book.
ii) Recovery of fine for breakages of laboratory equipments and any other loss caused to property of the college.
iii) Arrears of fees, if any.

If the caution deposit is less than the amount to be realised from the students the excess amount will be realised by other means as the Principal may decide.

4. The caution deposit paid by a student for a particular course in an institution shall be refunded to him/her after adjusting dues if any before completion of the course in that college, if the student applies for refund of the same and provided further the student takes T.C. from the college on ground of discontinuing the course or for pursuing the same/different course in some other institution.
5. All claims for refund of caution deposit shall be preferred before the reopening of the next academic year. It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund of caution deposit paid by him/her for the particular course immediately after the closing date of the college after the expiry of the academic year in which the course is completed or earlier when the claim for refund arises under the circumstance stated in Rule (3) above.
6. Immediately after expiry of the time limit prescribed for claiming the refund of the caution deposit amount, steps will be taken by the Principal of the college to publish the name of the students who have not claimed the deposits before the stipulated date in the Kerala Government Gazette and if he/she is not preferring the claim for refund of caution deposit within a period of two calendar months from the date of publication of the notification of the Principal in the Gazette, the whole amount due to the student shall be permanently forfeited and the same will be withdrawn from the caution deposit account and remitted to Government revenues.
7. The students should keep in the safe custody the receipt issued for remittance of the caution deposit amount during the tenure of the course.

The caution amount will be refunded only if the concerned receipt issued from the college is produced along with the application for refund of caution deposit. Failure to produce original receipt will result in the forfeiture of the claim for refund. The application for refund of caution deposit will be published in the college office.

8. **A receipt signed by the accountant shall be granted for every payment made which the student shall preserve and produce whenever required by the Principal.**
9. Absence with or without leave from the college shall not be an excuse for non payment of fees at the proper time.
10. Mistakes if any in the receipts issued for payment made should be pointed out then and there and got corrected on the spot. Complaints made later will not be entertained.
11. All cash transactions will be closed in the office at 2 p.m. everyday.

5. Utilise free hours with the facilities of the library, the common room etc, without disturbing the class work.
6. Help to keep the furniture and other equipment in the college neat and in the most serviceable condition. Do not disfigure college walls or furniture with any writing or engraving. Any loss or destruction to college properties will be chargeable individually or collectively according to the case.
7. Perfect silence should be maintained in the Reading Room and Library.
8. Representations on college affairs to the higher authorities shall be made only through the principal and to the Principal through the Head of the Department.
9. Except at the meetings of the College Association do not hold or address any gathering within the College premises without the Principal's permission.
10. No new association shall be formed in the college without the Principal's permission.

14. Students should always keep their Identity Cards with them till their course of study is completed and surrender the same at the time of receiving their transfer certificates.
15. A student should show his/her identity card to the Principal or staff of the college for verification as and when it is required.
16. Students will be fined collectively or individually if college property is damaged.
17. Students will not be allowed to sit in the waiting room or wander about in the college premises during class hours.
18. Students are not allowed to use Mobile Phone, Camera, and Video camera inside the college campus.
19. Students will not be allowed to use two wheelers inside the college campus. The vehicles should be parked in the parking space provided.
20. No permanent posters, Placards or flags will be allowed in the campus.
21. The use of Mobile phones is strictly prohibited inside the class rooms.

Attendance and Leave of absence

1. The working day is divided into two sessions and each session into periods of one hour.
2. Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each hour by the respective members of the staff.
3. Students should occupy their respective seats before attendance is taken.
4. For purpose of attendance, all working days shall be counted as full days irrespective of the number of working hours. The days that will be taken into account are those marked as working days in the College Calendar notified by the Principal (Special class will not be counted for extra attendance)
5. No student shall abstain himself from a class without leave.

6. Absence without leave for any hour or part thereof will be counted as absence for the respective session. Absence without leave for one session shall be considered as absence for the whole-day. If leave is required for the afternoon session only, the student should appear in person before the teacher concerned and get the application for leave recommended by him.
7. Application for leave should be made in the prescribed form to the Principal through the recommending authority by the student himself before hand. In the case of unforeseen circumstances application for leave must be submitted on the very first day the student returns to the college. Medical certificates should invariably be attached to leave application on medical grounds exceeding five days.
8. Students absenting themselves without leave for more than 10 working days will have their names removed from the rolls and they shall pay the re-admission fee and all college fee due, if any, before they are readmitted.
9. Students are warned that they should get 75 percent of the attendance of the year, If they fall short of the minimum, the deficiency will be condoned only when the syndicate is satisfied that the absence was for reasons beyond the control of the student. Deficiency exceeding 24 days will on no account be condoned. Condonation will not be granted for more than one academic year for any course of study.
10. Disciplinary action will be taken against those who repeatedly absent themselves on insufficient grounds.
11. The annual attendance certificates shall not be granted unless the student has got three fourth of the attendance prescribed by the college for the course of instruction to the satisfaction of the authorities and his/her progress and conduct have been satisfactory.
12. The name of the student, who does not pay the fees, will be removed from the rolls and he will not be eligible for attendance for the defaulted period.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The General Library located in the main building is a treasure-trove of books. It subscribes to all prominent newspapers and magazines in Malayalam and English. It has vast collection of books including encyclopedias, poetry, fiction and non-fiction and books on science, philosophy, religion, sports etc. The library functions from 9 am to 4 pm on all working days. There are two references sections in the general library namely the Avinhat Nair Memorial Library instituted by Prof. G.K. Nayar of the Chemistry Department and Kummini Memorial Library instituted in the memory of the Late Professor Kummini Vasudevan Namboothiri of the Malayalam Department. Besides the General Library all Departments have their department libraries generally under the respective Heads of the Department. The General Library provides INFLIBNET (Information and Library Network) facility. INFLIBNET is a major national programme initiated by the UGC in March 1991. INFLIBNET is involved in modernizing university libraries in India and connecting them as well as information centers in the country through a nationwide high speed data network using the state-of-art technologies for the optimum utilization of information.
