Being an NSS volunteer is a source of immense pride for me. I firmly believe that my



Volunteers actively participate in diverse activities, achieving milestones like the successful growth of Palmyra plants and the flourishing of 152 trees representing 37 species. The park not only enriches the college campus but also instils responsibility and environmental consciousness in NSS volunteers, contributing to their holistic personality development.

Nurturing Sustainability: My Role as NSS Volunteer Secretary in OrgaVrudhi Program

As the NSS Volunteer Secretary during the academic year 2022-2023, I took on the responsibility of organizing the OrgaVrudhi program at Sree Krishna College Guruvayur, a flagship initiative of NSS Units 190 & 191. Being a B.Sc Zoology student, I integrated my knowledge into the program, particularly focusing on directing volunteers in the cultivation of organic crops and the production of compost.



OrgaVrudhi, to promote organic farming practices and sustainable agriculture. NSS volunteers, under my leadership, actively participated in cultivating crops like chillies, brinjal, ladies' finger, and bananas without the use of chemical pesticides and fertilizers.



In 2022, our efforts resulted in a harvest of 28.2kg of green chillies and brinjal across 21 phases. We distributed this produce to teachers, non-teaching staff, and the houses of volunteers, creating awareness about the benefits of organic farming. The success of the program was further highlighted through an exhibition and the sale of the harvested vegetables within the college.



We harvested a total of 34 kg (green chillies and brinjal) as 21 phases. We are serving this to the teachers, non-teaching staffs, villagers and also to the houses of volunteers.
